


Saintly holiness IS possible! Together, let us seek holiness with the saints as our inspiration.

Solemnity of St. John the Baptist
June 24, 2021.



Tomorrow is the Solemnity of St. John the Baptist.

John began his public ministry around 30 AD and was known for attracting large crowds to the Jordan River to be baptized. He instructed his followers to turn to Christ, calling Him the "Lamb of God."

When Jesus himself came to be baptized, John recognized Him and said, "It is I who need baptism from you." John recognized that Jesus was God's son and therefore sinless and did not need to be baptized. Jesus told John to baptize Him anyway, whereupon the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God was seen as a dove. The voice of God spoke, saying, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

Through our baptism by water and the Holy Spirit, we are united as one people in Jesus Christ!
